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Admissions Policy

Art is not only a fundamental force that has nurtured humanity up to this point in time, but also a force of unknown potential to open up new avenues for the future.

Tama Art University respects the power of the arts that has established traditions, and supports the power of the arts to transform itself for an unknown future. We creatively synthesize artistic tradition and artistic innovation.

The arts will be deeply involved in an increasing number of fields (medical care, information, industry, corporate management, space development, artificial intelligence, etc.) and will play an important role at the intersection of these fields. The arts have the power to creatively connect various fields. By boldly crossing the boundaries between art and design, technology and theory, and synthesizing various fields of expression in a new dimension, art will be renewed (innovated).

Doctoral Degree Program in Graduate School of Art and Design

The doctoral degree program in Tama Art University Graduate School of Art and Design is seeking individuals who are not only independent creators and researchers of art, but are capable of opening up new pathways in the future of art and the unknown possibilities of art, and creating new value in the arts, and those who will become global leaders and instructors in the field of art.

Therefore, the entrance examination for the doctoral degree program will test whether the applicant can not only demonstrate various abilities as an expressive person in their area of specialization, but also whether they can create a new field of expression itself, and whether they can express, research, and teach at an international level. In addition to creating value, they must also be able to pass that value on to future generations, in other words, they must be creative in their ability to educate. The results must be presented to society widely in the form of world-class works, books, etc., that mark an era and must be returned to the public.

Applicants who have completed a master's degree (master's program) or have an equivalent qualification are eligible to take the examination.

Selection Method

In the primary selection, document screening is performed based on the research plan, a summary of the master's thesis or equivalent, portfolio (practical course applicants), list of research achievements (thesis only applicants), and submitted documents (including the results of language and certification examinations). For applicants who have passed the primary selection, secondary selection is performed based on their submitted thesis, submitted artwork (only for practical course applicants), and oral examination.

Concept of Entrance Examination

We aim to nurture human resources for future leadership positions with broad insight and skills in all aspects of art and design, and to nurture artists and art theorists with the ability to make comprehensive judgments that can respond to significant advances in academic research and social change. We require applicants to submit theses and works (only for practical course applicants) to examine the applicants' research ability in each of the subdivided areas, as well as to submit a research plan and to take an oral examination in order to examine the balance in relation to their comprehensive academic fields.

Instructions for Entrance Examination Applicants

Tama Art University administers its entrance examinations strictly to ensure that all applicants can demonstrate their abilities in a fair and impartial environment. To prevent any misconduct that could compromise the fairness of the examinations, the following guidelines have been established. Please read the following information carefully and adhere strictly to these rules when taking the examination.

Acts that may be deemed misconduct:

1. Cases involving forgery, false statements, imitation or infringement of the rights of others in the information, documents or materials submitted at the time of application.
2. The following acts during the examination:
 - (a) Cheating by concealing or attaching reference materials (including self-prepared materials) to permitted items;
 - (b) Use of stationery, equipment or tools that are not authorised for use;
 - (c) Using communication devices, such as mobile phones, at unauthorised times;
 - (d) Failure to place communication devices, such as mobile phones, in the designated envelope (including cases where the candidate possesses multiple devices);
 - (e) Failure to follow the instructions of the examiner;
 - (f) Conduct that causes inconvenience to other examinees.
 - (g) Taking the exam by impersonating the applicant (e.g. having a substitute take the exam).
 - (h) Peeking at or copying another examinee's answers.
 - (i) Any other conduct that undermines the fairness of the exam.

In cases of suspected misconduct, the following measures may be taken:

- A warning from the exam proctor
- An interview by the exam proctor or other authorised personnel
- Requiring the student to place any materials or personal items suspected of being used for misconduct into their bag or similar container
- Inspection of materials or personal items suspected of being used for misconduct (whether during or after the exam), and photographing them for the purpose of preserving evidence
- Confirmation of possession of communication devices, such as mobile phones, during times when their use is not permitted
- Presentation of identification documents (e.g., passport, My Number Card, driver's license) may be required for identity verification.
- Additional Verification

If the university determines that misconduct has occurred, the following measures may be taken:

- Prohibition from taking entrance examinations for all departments, majors and courses at the university for the current academic year (the entrance examination fee will not be refunded); and
- Disqualification of results from all entrance examinations at the university for the current academic year.
- Filing of a Police Report

Eligible Candidates

Any person who falls under, or is expected to fall under, any of the following by March 31, 2027.

1. A person who holds a master's or professional degree.
2. A person who has been awarded a master's degree or a degree equivalent to a professional degree in a foreign country.
3. A person who has been awarded a master's degree or a degree equivalent to a professional degree after completing correspondence courses offered by foreign schools in Japan.
4. A person who has been awarded a master's degree or a degree equivalent to a professional degree after completing a course at an educational institution in Japan that is positioned in the school education system of the foreign country as having a foreign university course and is separately designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.
5. A person designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.
6. A person who is recognized by the University as having academic ability equivalent or superior to a master's or professional degree through an individual admission eligibility screening, and has reached the age of 24.

Precautions for the Secondary Selection

1. Please be sure to enter the examination site at least 30 minutes before the start of the examination.
2. Only late arrivals within 30 minutes after the start of the examination will be allowed to take the examination.
3. If you arrive late, the test time will not be extended for any reason.
4. You will not be allowed to enter the examination site unless you bring your Jukenhyō. If you forget to bring your Jukenhyō, please notify the staff.
5. No borrowing, lending, or sharing of equipment is permitted.
6. Do not enter any areas other than your respective examination site and designated areas.
7. There is no clock in the examination room. Please bring your own if necessary.
8. You cannot use communication devices (cell phones, smart phones, PCs, smart watches, etc.) in the examination room and during the examination.
9. Only students taking the examination are allowed to enter the premises.
10. If you contract an infectious disease (such as influenza, measles, or the novel coronavirus infectious disease (COVID-19) for which attendance is suspended under the School Health and Safety Act), you are not allowed to take the examination in principle, as it may spread to other students, exam proctors, and others.
11. The start and end times and duration of the examinations may be adjusted due to weather conditions or public transportation disruptions.
12. Any changes to these guidelines will be indicated on the University's website and announced on the day of the examination.

- * When submitting your work, please be sure to bring a certificate from the supervising faculty member of the graduate school from which you graduated certifying that the work was produced by you (labels for works and thesis for submission [page 22]). (This is also required for prospective master's degree holders and research students of the Graduate School of Tama Art University.)
- * You cannot exceed the specified time.
- * Be sure to bring your Jukenhyō.
- * You are responsible for carrying in and installing your own work.
- * As a general rule, you are responsible for preparing your own supplies for installation and equipment for playing your video works.
- * The University will not be responsible for works falling or toppling over due to inadequate installation during the submission period.

●Oral examination on Wednesday, January 20 and Thursday, January 21, 2027

Terms and Conditions for Submission of Work

For practical applicants, please bring in and submit your work in accordance with the following terms and conditions*.

Common matters

- Works must be installed within the space designated in the venue (300 cm in height×360cm in width×360cm in depth). Please note that the venue entrance measures approximately 260cm in height and 270cm in width.
- The walls of the venue may not be used directly, except in the case of setting a large work against the wall. Use pre-loaned perforated panels in place of walls.
- The lighting of the venue cannot be adjusted.
- You cannot hang your artwork from the ceiling.
- When using equipment, please prepare a clearly written instruction manual on how to operate the equipment and submit it to the staff on the day of submission of the work.
- No work may be installed at heights greater than 2 meters (only one stepladder is provided on each floor. When you use a stepladder, you must arrange an assistant to accompany you.)
- Please provide protection and cover as necessary to prevent damage to facilities and fixtures.
- The University will not be responsible for any damage or accident caused by natural disasters or other force majeure.
- With the exception of the equipment loaned by the University (see below), you may not borrow any equipment or tools to be used for submitting artwork, and you need to prepare them in advance.
- No modification (drilling, nailing, riveting, etc.) of equipment loaned by the University is allowed.
- Please complete the submission within the prescribed time and have it checked by the staff before leaving the examination site.
- No shooting with cameras or video cameras is allowed in the venue, even if the subject is your own artwork.

Precautions for submitting three-dimensional works

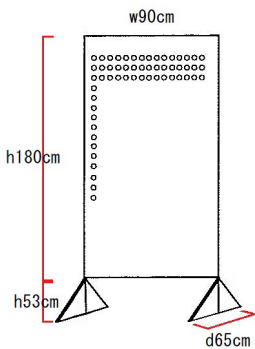
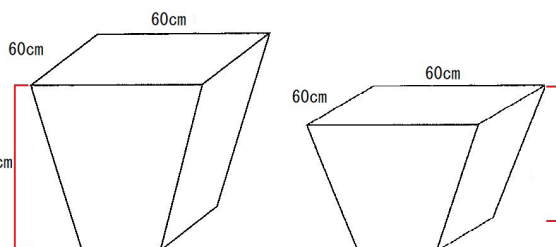
- If the work you wish to submit exceeds the specified scope, please submit it as documentation or make changes to the formation of the work.
- Please take your own measures to prepare for natural disasters, especially for works made of fragile materials such as glass.

Precautions for submitting two-dimensional works

- Works shall be submitted by hanging them on perforated panels installed at the venue, not on the walls.
- Hooks for hanging works on perforated panels may be borrowed at the venue if desired. However, please prepare the strings and screw eye bolts to be attached to the backside of the work in advance by yourself.
- For works that exceed the usable area of the perforated panel, weigh more than 5kg, have no place to hang, have a depth of more than 10cm, or are deemed unstable or unsafe, place the work on the floor (be careful not to make it dirty) and set it against the wall, taking care to prevent it from falling over.
- When you put up paper, posters, etc., apply double-sided tape, etc., on top of curing/masking tape to prevent damage to the panel surface.

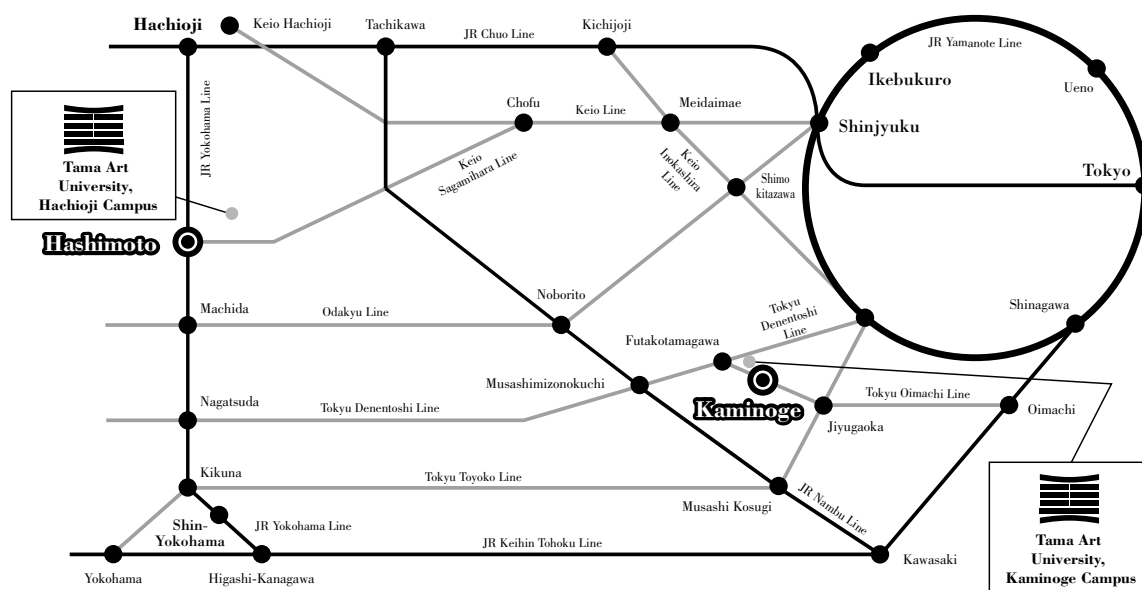

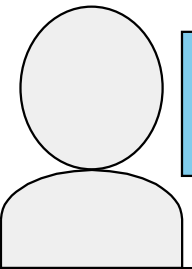

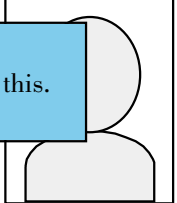
